Chairman's Report

As many will be aware, I have announced that I will not stand for a Board position at the 2023 Annual General Meeting, subsequently this will be one of my last contributions to Toucher.

I have been fortunate to have held a number of positions on the Board over the past 6 years with the last 4 as your chairperson. It has been my great honour to represent you over those last 6 years and I sincerely hope that on reflection I might have been a good servant of the club and its membership over that time.

Due to the onset of COVID 19 the past few years have been somewhat tumultuous for our club, as indeed the broader community. During the early stage of the COVID shutdown, rumors circulated that our club might not re-emerge in an operational position. However, to those doubters' great surprise, we re-emerged well and now find ourselves in a strong financial position. The past 2 years alone have seen record trading and a continuation of this will hold us in good stead well into the future.

The hard work undertaken by your club management team and respective club Boards is a credit to our small club and as members you are now the beneficiaries. Critical advancements such as the engagement of permanent greenkeeping staff as well as completion of an expansive important capital works program could not have occurred without the viable financial means to do so.

Well in excess of \$225,000 has been expended undertaking improvements in and around the club on your behalf over the past 2 years alone. These improvements have been undertaken to ensure a more enjoyable playing and club experience for members and visitors alike. Further improvements can, and will, only occur with ongoing member financial support and the equally important support of the future Board and Bowls Committees.

I would like to personally thank all club members and our entire club staff who have supported me over the past 6 years. I have made some dear friends through the process and am hoping, lower back ailment permitting, to spend more time out on the greens once my club commitments have abated.

I would also like to make special mention of a number of special people whom have risen well above their positions to support myself and the club over the past years.

Firstly, Miriam Jackson who has been my deputy and advisor on all bowls related matters. In my own opinion the position of Bowls Operations and Greens Director is unquestionably the most challenging position on the Board. Miriam along with husband Tony, seldom get the credit for the amount of work they undertake on behalf of members and our club. On behalf of all members, I offer a sincere thank you to you both.

Secondly, a big thank you to our Treasurer Charles Rottier whom has brought a real sense of professionalism to the financial management of our club. Without Charles sage advice and support over the past 2 years many of the projects that we have undertaken may still have only been in planning.

Furthermore, many thanks to our General Manager Tracey Evans, whom has fulfilled the Club Secretary role over the past 6 years. Tracey undertakes a large amount of unseen and undervalued work and has been instrumental to a number of the improvements made within our club. Thank you, Tracey, along with your management team and all of our wonderful staff.

The Club will soon be holding AGM's for all sections in August/September and I encourage all members new or old to consider standing for positions.

Finally, to all other Board members, Committee persons, volunteers and all others involved in any operational activity here at the club, I thank you for your personal sacrifice and work over the past years and hope that you might continue these roles into the future.

Bowls Operations & Greens Report

I will start this report by addressing the proposed changes to the By Laws as the process has created some unanticipated responses to what was intended to be a routine update based on committee discussions.

Some of these changes were initiated at Committee level and were recommended to the Board for review, display and assessment of feedback before either adoption or setting aside by the Board. Based on specific and constructive written comments the Board withdrew one of the initial proposals and will continue to work with the men's committee in particular to refine the wording of the posted amendments to ensure they achieve the outcome intended.

It is disappointing that we received a general objection to the proposed By Law changes with some 20 members names listed as opposing the changes, none of whom has approached Committee members or Board members about their concerns.

We are not a big club and members should be able to find someone on the Committees or Board to talk to privately if you do not want to be publicly identified.

It has also come to the Board's attention that one (unwritten) reason for objecting to the proposed changes was that the changes would give more power to the Bowls Co-Ordinator and Bowls Operations and Greens Director. Please be very clear, none of these changes have in any way changed the roles, authority or responsibilities of either of these positions, nor has any request been made to make such changes. The Committee and Board members of this club commit significant time and effort to supporting our bowls activities and to suggest that these changes are designed to somehow give more power to these roles is very misplaced, very disappointing and hurtful to those who give their time to this club.

As the Chairman has stated we have an AGM coming please feel free to nominate for the Board, Ladies Committee or Men's Committee and then you will see that decisions made are not done lightly.

To the majority of members who are happy to come to bowls and are grateful to still have a Club with its doors open after Covid and know that our Club is in a sound financial position because of decisions made by your Board and Committee members, thank you.

Congratulations to all our championship winners, Ladies A Singles was won by Laurina Howarde and the Men's A Singles was won by Peter Brady. All our A Grade events have been completed and the B Grade events are well under way, thank you to all the players who kept the games on track, only a couple of hold ups this year. The introduction of an ON day for the men kept games going forward and the ability for games to be organised on the same day, we received a lot of compliments from members and visitors to the Club on these days saying how good it was to see the men playing in uniform. Good luck to all those going to the Champion of Club Champions your Games Co-Orinators will inform you of the play dates.
