Chairman's Report

As you might be aware the critical position of Board Secretary has not been filled for a number of years. As a consequence, the position has had to be provided by our General Manager, Tracey Evans. While Tracey does a wonderful job as our Secretary/Manager it would be advantageous to have a club member filling the important Secretary position.

With relation to myself I have been asked by fellow Board members, as well as club members, if I would consider staying on the Board as a Director. Whilst being truly appreciative of members' support of my continuance at Board level; I believe it is necessary to make a clean break and provide the incoming Chair, freedom to influence his/her future direction of our club.

In relation to the incoming Chair position, it has generally been accepted for continuity purposes, although not mandatory, that the incoming chairperson be an existing member of the Board. This in fact, was how I became the Chair back at the 2019 AGM, when the majority of the Board positions were vacated.

I am pleased to announce that our current Director, Bowls Recruitment - Mark McLatchey has confirmed that he will accept a nomination for the position of Board Chair. Mark's nomination has my full support as I firmly believe he will make an excellent Chairperson. During his working career Mark has filled a number of management positions which will hold him in great stead to represent our club membership.

I further understand that our hard-working Director, Bowls Operations and Greens - Miriam Jackson is also proposing to accept a nomination to stand for re-election to this important position. Miriam's commitment to this role over the past few years has been exemplary and she has my unqualified support to continue in this very much underestimated role.

Dave McCarthy who has provided the role of Director, Building and Maintenance over the past two years sadly advises that he will not be accepting a nomination for the position at the AGM.

If you have ever considered how, you can support your club and make a real difference, I implore you to consider nominating for any of the above vacant positions on the Board or at the subsequent Bowls Committee general meetings.
